Yam Daisy: This plant was once prolific in Victoria but was largely eliminated by agricultural practices. The tuberous root was eaten by the indigenous people and it was a staple of their diet. It can be confused with the introduced dandelion but the flower is larger and the flower head droops before it opens. Also, look at the leaves, they have "teeth".

Blue Pincushion: This delightful herb is easily overlooked when not in flower. This example is a wonderful addition to our wildflower meadow.
